Re: 2012 Bethel visitors information

Dear Brothers:

At Psalm 122:1 the psalmist wrote: “I rejoiced when they were saying to me: ‘To the house of Jehovah let us go.’” Many have made similar expressions regarding their visit and tour of the world headquarters and the United States Bethel facilities in Brooklyn, Patterson, and Wallkill, New York. Perhaps you were one of the 71,442 who visited during the 2011 service year. If you have not yet had the opportunity to tour, or if you would like to visit again, we cordially invite you to do so.

The following overview of what you can expect to see during your tours at each location may help you in planning your itinerary.

Brooklyn Bethel: The guided tour features a number of displays highlighting how the worldwide work is directed by the world headquarters and the supportive role played by the United States Bethel family. Before or after your guided tour, you may wish to browse the historical archive room in the 25 Columbia Heights lobby. This highlights the expansion of the work in modern times. Additionally, you can view displays and video clips illustrating some of the methods used to distribute the good news. You should allow at least 30 minutes to view these displays and videos. A literature counter is also available. *Guided tour time: 2 hours.*

Patterson Bethel: The guided tour will describe the work being done at the Theocratic Schools, such as the Watchtower Bible School of Gilead, the School for Branch Committee Members and Their Wives, and the School for Traveling Overseers and Their Wives. You will also see displays describing the work done in the offices, which include the Art, Audio/Video Services, Legal, Service, and Translation Services departments. Before or after your guided tour, you may wish to view displays in the main lobby highlighting the history of the worldwide Bible educational work of Jehovah’s Witnesses in modern times. You should allow at least 20 minutes to view these displays and videos. *Guided tour time: 1.5 hours.*

Wallkill Bethel: The guided tour will enable you to see how Bible literature is printed, bound, and shipped to congregations in the United States, the Caribbean, and other parts of the world. A portion of this tour also includes the Bethel Home and an explanation of the production and processing of food for the United States Bethel family. Before or after your guided tour, you may wish to view tour videos and displays in the main lobby highlighting the history of the *Watchtower* and *Awake!* magazines, as well as farming and computer operations. You should allow at least 30 minutes to view these displays and videos. A literature counter is also available. *Guided tour time: 2.5 hours.*

Dress and grooming: Before you plan your visit it would be good to review the brochure *Dress & Grooming for Visitors Touring Bethel* that was sent with the letter dated March 6, 2008, to all congregations. Please check with a member of the Congregation Service Committee in this regard. At all times our dress and grooming should reflect the decency and dignity that befit servants of Jehovah God. (*km* 3/98 p. 7; *od* p. 138 par. 3) Our clothing should have a positive influence on others as to how they view the true worship of Jehovah.

However, it has been noted that when visiting Bethel, some brothers and sisters tend to be extremely casual in their dress. Such dress is not appropriate when visiting Bethel. In this matter, as in all other aspects of our Christian life, we desire to maintain the same high standards that distinguish God's people from the world by our doing all things for God's glory. (Rom. 12:2; 1 Cor. 10:31) It is also good to speak with our Bible students and others who may be visiting Bethel for the first time and remind them of the importance of giving attention to proper dress and grooming. Since considerable walking is involved while on tour, it would be practical to wear dignified shoes that are comfortable to walk in.

When visiting Bethel, ask yourself: 'Is my dress and grooming modest?' (Compare Micah 6:8.) 'Does it reflect well on the God that I worship? Would others be distracted or offended by my appearance? Am I setting the proper example for others who may be visiting for the first time?' Not only when visiting Bethel, but at any other time as well, we want to 'recommend ourselves as God's ministers in every way,' including by our appropriate dress and grooming.—2 Cor. 6:3, 4.

Tour hours: All facilities are open to tours Monday through Friday, from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. However, no tours will be offered on April 5, 2012 (Memorial) and May 11, 2012 (spring cleaning). When preparing for your visit, please keep in mind the amount of time required to tour each location, and plan to arrive early enough to receive a complete tour. If you plan to visit more than one of the facilities, be sure to allow sufficient travel time between locations (see next page) and time for meal arrangements. *If you would like more information regarding any of these facilities, please write to the Central Tour Desk at the address shown in the following paragraph.*

Large groups: If traveling with a small group, there is no need to call in advance, since tours begin every half hour. However, if your group includes **20 or more persons**, the group coordinator should obtain a copy of the *Watchtower Tour Group Information* form from a member of the Congregation Service Committee. The completed form should be returned to the branch office at least **three weeks** in advance of your visit. For large groups traveling by bus, the Central Tour Desk can also assist in arranging your itinerary so as to reduce the waiting time for a tour during busy periods. Please remember that buses are not able to travel on all highways. No buses visiting Brooklyn should enter Brooklyn Heights. Please note the recommended routes on the map provided upon request by contacting the Central Tour Desk.

Transportation information: Please exercise due caution while in the New York City area. Carefully read parking signs, and do not leave items exposed in your vehicles. Reduced-rate parking information for Brooklyn can be obtained from the Bethel lobbies. Those using a computer mapping program may use the following addresses to map a route:

Please note the following travel times and distances between the United States Bethel facilities:

Brooklyn Bethel to Patterson Bethel	1.5 hours	70 miles
Brooklyn Bethel to Wallkill Bethel	2.25 hours	94 miles
Wallkill Bethel to Patterson Bethel	1.25 hours	52 miles
Travel time subject to traffic. Buses add 30 minutes to travel time.		

Lodging information: If you would like to visit sometime during the upcoming year, please see a member of the Congregation Service Committee. He has been provided with information, including the *2012 Bethel Visitors Lodging and Car Rental List*, that will be useful to you in preparing for your visit. New hotels have been added to the list for the coming year, others have been deleted, and room rates have changed at many hotels.

Before making *any* hotel reservations, please read the information located at the beginning of the *2012 Bethel Visitors Lodging and Car Rental List*. Those instructions outline the arrangements that have been made with the hotels. When contacting hotels on the list, please adhere closely to those instructions. We suggest you have two or three alternate dates and/or hotels in mind when making reservations, especially if you are representing a group.

Negative reports have been received regarding the conditions at some bed and breakfast accommodations in the vicinity of Brooklyn Bethel. Standards of cleanliness and service at these establishments can be very inconsistent. Unless you have visited the bed and breakfast yourself or it is recommended by someone who has, it would be wise to exercise caution with this kind of accommodation.

We are confident that your visit to Bethel will prove to be both encouraging and motivating. May Jehovah continue to bless your efforts in serving his Kingdom interests.
